Greetings Colleton Families,

As the district plans for summer programs, we note that 2020-2021 school year has been a year like no other. Summer 2021 will offer instruction and support to any student who wishes to attend and qualifies for additional assistance based on their current school performance. The face-to-face summer program will take place from Monday, June 28, 2021 through Friday, July 23, 2021, with times varying depending on location. The registration form for summer programs will be available on Monday, March 15, 2021 online and registration will close Friday, April 30, 2021. You will choose only one program per child by completing a separate form for each child. Use the next grade that your child will be “rising to” in the Fall of 2021 to select the program that fits your child (children). The following programs will be offered:

- Summer school support for Pre-K for preschoolers who are at least 4 years old by September 1, 2021. Students will learn early literacy skills such as beginning sounds, word sounds, pictures, letter writing, etc. Will be held at Black Street Early Childhood Education Center.
- Summer school support for rising Kindergarteners. Students will learn early literacy skills such as letter sounds, rhyming, word families, and building reading habits. Will be held at Black Street Early Childhood Education Center.
- Summer school support for rising 1st graders. The instructional focus will be on reading and math with enrichment activities provided for students during the day. The program will be held at Black Street Early Childhood Education Center.
- Summer school support for rising 2nd graders. The instructional focus will be on reading and math with enrichment activities provided for students during the day. The program will be held at Forest Hills Elementary School.
- Summer school support for rising 3rd graders. The instructional focus will be on reading and math with enrichment activities provided for students during the day. The program will be held at Forest Hills Elementary School.
- Summer school support for rising 4th graders. The instructional focus will be on reading and math with enrichment activities provided for students during the day. The program will be held at Forest Hills Elementary School.
- Summer school support for rising 5th graders. The instructional focus will be on reading and math with enrichment activities provided for students

during the day. The program will be held at Forest Hills Elementary School.

- Summer school support for rising 6th graders. The instructional focus will be on reading and math with enrichment activities provided for students during the day. Students may be able to participate in enrichment activities provided by 21st Century GAP. The program will be held at Colleton County Middle School.
- Summer school support for rising 7th and rising 8th graders at Colleton County Middle School. The instructional focus will be on reading, math, science and social studies. Students may be able to participate in enrichment activities provided by 21st Century GAP. The program will be held at Colleton County Middle School.
- Summer school support for rising 9th graders. The instructional focus will be on reading, math, science and social studies. This program will be held at Colleton County High School.
- Summer school support for students rising to grades 10 through 12 at Colleton County High School. Students will be able to enroll and complete courses for credit recovery. The program will be held at Colleton County High School.
- Migrant Summer Education Program for all grade levels. If your child is part of a family only in the county doing seasonal work in agricultural areas, check this program. This program will be held at Forest Hills Elementary School.
- 21st Century GAP at Colleton County Middle School. The program provides students with academic support and enrichment activities. The program will be held at Colleton County Middle School.

Colleton County School District plans to operate the Summer 2021 programs applying safety guidelines and recommendations from the Center for Disease Control (CDC). When enrolling your child summer programs, please plan to commit to his/her attendance for the entire four weeks. Spaces will be reserved for your child according to CDC guidelines in both the classroom and on the buses (if transportation is requested). For these reasons, registrations will not be accepted after April 30, 2021. There will be no exceptions.

Complete this form by Friday, April 30, 2021. Note that devices will be provided to support summer instruction, but the program will be face-to-face in-person instruction. Thank you and we look forward to serving your child this summer.
